#### **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

Applicant: City of Saratoga Springs, NY

Using one page, state the objectives, work to be performed, the methodology to be employed, an estimated timetable, anticipated products (quantified), and qualifications of primary project personnel.

This funding proposal is to update the Casino/Congress Park/Circular Street Historic District, Union Avenue Historic District & and White Street and Regent Street survey information. At the time that these two historic districts were listed on the National Register of Historic Places no data was provided on accessory buildings (carriage houses, garages, commercial buildings, etc.). Therefore there is no information on the style, date of construction, or whether the accessory building is "contributing" or "non-contributing." In recent years the City of Saratoga Springs has received applications proposing alterations or demolition to accessory structures. It is critical that the City of Saratoga Springs and the Design Review Commission have updated and enhanced information during the application review.

The Casino/Congress Park/Circular Street Historic District was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1972 and the survey information has not been updated since its initial listing. At the time of listing, there were 18 tax parcels that contained with 16 principal structures.

The Union Avenue Historic District was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1978 and also has not been updated since its initial listing. At the time of listing, there were55 tax parcels with 63 buildings including Yaddo and the Saratoga Race Course. This past year Yaddo was individually listed as a National Historic Landmark thus there is no need to resurvey Yaddo. A Cultural Resource Survey completed in 2010 and 2011 surveyed an estimated 80% of the over 200 structures and 350 acre parcel of the Saratoga Race Course. All areas of the "frontside" of the track, which includes all public buildings – i.e. the Grandstand, Clubhouse, Saddling Shed, and Jockey House - and portions of the "backside" were surveyed, including the oldest, most significant portions of the race course – i.e. Horse Haven, Madden Court, Camp Court, Millionaires Row, Claire Court, and Sanford Court. In addition, a DEIS has recently been prepared that includes information on the remaining buildings that were not included in the Cultural Resource Survey. Therefore, the Saratoga Race Course would not be included in this project proposal. The resurvey would focus on all other parcels within the district.

In 1987, through funding of a CLG grant, 36 properties on Regent Street and White Street were surveyed and evaluated for potential expansion of the Union Avenue and Casino/Congress Park/Circular Street Historic Districts. A resurvey of this information would provide the necessary information to evaluate whether or not the recommendations from the 1987 CLG survey are still valid.

In addition to providing important baseline survey information for the Design Review Commission, this proposed project to update the survey information of these areas would fulfill the City of Saratoga Springs Certified Local Government requirement to update and maintain survey information and provide the State Historic Preservation Office with current information that can be filed in the National Park Service.

Other than the most recent resurvey of the East Side Historic District that was completed with 2013 CLG funding, survey information is currently not available in digital format. This project would allow for greater access for building information and photographs and would be available to the public through the City of Saratoga Springs and the Saratoga Springs Preservation Foundation.

The survey would provide digital photographs of each primary and accessory building; identify the approximate date of construction, style, and character-defining features; and a determination of "contributing / non-contributing" for all accessory buildings. This information would be entered into an existing Access Database, which allows information to be exported into an Excel format. The updated survey would be in compliance with the "Guidelines for Local Surveys: A Basis for Preservation Planning" National Register Bulletin, 1997 and "How to Apply the National Register District Criteria for Evaluation, National Register Bulletin, 2007.

The project would be in partnership with the Saratoga Springs Preservation Foundation, which has staff/volunteers that have professional historic preservation expertise. The survey would take approximately 12 months to complete with work beginning immediately following notification that the grant was approved and be completed September 30, 2016.

#### ASSURANCE

#### CIVIL RIGHTS ASSURANCE
